You can register online at www.quadcityhockey.com by clicking on "Online Registration." **All QCHA players** (including One Goal and One Goal Plus players) **need to be registered with USA Hockey.**

For new registration:

1. Go to www.usahockeyregistration.com
2. Choose the member type – "Ice Player / Coach"
3. You must be 18 years of age or older – click on the box that acknowledges that you are 18 or older.
4. Select the correct season – 2010 – 2011
5. Follow the prompts... fill in all data completely. When prompted to answer what state is your affiliate based in, please answer IOWA.
6. Process your payment – Visa, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, or Visa Gift Cards are accepted.
7. Print your confirmation page. You will also receive a confirmation via email – forward this email to the registrar at registrar@quadcityhockey.com AND save this email until you have confirmation from the Quad City Hockey Association that you have successfully completed the registration process.
